- Fach game last season between Flizabethtown and Catholic were played within two possessions The Cardinals won by three at home in early January 2018. The Blue Jays were able to split the season series with a five-point win at home in mid-February. E-town is 4-7 all-time against Catholic.
- Lydia Lawson was named the Landmark Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Monday after averaging 31.0 ppg in wins over Goucher and Susquehanna. Lawson had E-town's first 30-point game since Rachel Forjan's 30 at Merchant Marine in 2016. Her 37 points were the most in a game for Elizabethtown since 2012. She also hit 19 free throws, the most since 2012, and her 24 attempts at the foul line were the most since 2008. The junior helped the Blue Jays come back from a nine-point halftime deficit against the River Hawks and scored 13 of the 15 E-town points in OT to liftthe Jays to the 82-74 win.
- Catholic has won a pair of tournaments this season. Led by juniors Sydney Poindexter and Megan Stafford, along with freshman Luca Mamula, the Cardinals won the Stockton Tip-Off Tournament, beating the host Ospreys in the title game. CATHU outscored Stockton 34-18 in the second half to run away with the game. Catholic dominated the boards, finishing the game with 57 rebounds to Stockton's 23. In turn, the Cardinals had a 29-6 advantage in second chance points and a 38-20 margin in points in the paint.

Poindexter went on to be named the tournament MVP of the Jamie Lynn Roberts Tournament as Catholic won its own holiday tourney. The junior put up 12 points, 5 rebounds, and 4 steals to help the Cards to the championship.

- Elizabethtown got its first Landmark win of the season last Wednesday at Goucher in an 81-48 rout, though the Blue Jays didn't blow the game open until the third quarter. The Gophers hung tough with the Jays through the first half and only trailed by a point, 31-30. E-town went on a 31-7 run in the third quarter to take a 25-point lead into the fourth and grew it from there to a 33-point victory, their largest of the season. Along with Lawson, Veronica Christ (16), Angie Hawkins (15), and Marissa Emlet (10) were in double figures for the Jays. It was a season-high for Hawkins.
- The Blue Jays will remain at Thompson Gymnasium for a Saturday afternoon matchup with Drew at 2 p.m.
