THE STARTING 5

1 Elizabethtown was able to get the better of Catholic twice during the regular season with a 75-64 win at home and a 72-38 win on the road. In the four times the Blue Jays have qualified for the Landmark Conference Championships, they have faced the Cardinals three times, including tonight's semifinal. Catholic is 2-0 against E-town in the postseason coming into tonight.

2 A few defensive plays made by Elizabethtown helped win them the game on Saturday against Moravian. **Marissa Emlet**, **Lydia Lawson**, and **Veronica Christ** each came up with steals on three straight possessions for the Greyhounds late in the game. While E-town had the Hounds down by double figures, Maddie Capuano led the visitors back and even took the lead late, but the Jays' defense prevailed and some late foul shots gave EC their winning margin.

The win put Elizabethtown at 11-3 in the Landmark, their best-ever finish in the conference since joining the league in the 2014-15 season. It is the third time in the last 5 seasons that EC has won at least 18 games.

3 Catholic needed some help from Elizabethtown to get into the playoffs. Juniors **Mollie Reynolds** and **Megan Stafford** combined for 19 points, 19 rebounds, and 9 steals in a road win at Drew to help the Cardinals clinch their postseason berth. Catholic, who finished 8-6 along with Moravian and Juniata, held the tiebreaker due to their win over ranked Scranton on February 2.

The Cardinals fell to 1-4 with their first loss to Elizabethtown back on January 16, but went 7-2 over their final nine conference games, including that critical win over the Royals to assist in qualifying for the Landmark Championships.

4 Christ recorded a career-high 27 points against Catholic in the game held at Thompson Gymnasium. Emlet and **Mikayla Ruth** each recorded double-doubles in the victory for the Blue Jays. Christ was 10-of-20 from the floor and 4-for-6 from deep. Emlet had 13 points and 10 rebounds while Ruth had 13 points and 11 boards.

5 The winner of tonight's semifinal will either play at top-seeded Scranton or host fourth-seeded Moravian for a chance at the 2019 Landmark Conference Women's Basketball Championship on Sunday, February 24, at 1 p.m.
