5 THINGS TO KNOW

1 Dating back to 1988, Elizabethtown is 19-3-2 all-time against Drew. This will be the Rangers' third visit to Ira R. Herr Field since E-town joined the Landmark Conference. The Blue Jays have not lost in four conference meetings and are 2-0 at home against Drew.

2 In the most recent four contests between the schools, Elizabethtown has been able to outscore Drew 9-1, including 6-0 at home. The Rangers were in the driver's seat in last year's meeting in Madison, N.J. on Leah Dentale's first-half goal. Drew led through 73 minutes, but then **Lydia Lawson** and **Alli Lasky** scored goals less than seven minutes apart and E-town left their conference opener that season with a 2-1 win. Lawson converted a penalty kick and Lasky scored in the run of play.

3 The Rangers opened the season at Centenary's Kickoff Classic, losing to Westfield State 1-0 and defeating the hosts the following day, 4-0. At their own Fall Festival a weekend later, Drew beat Coast Guard 1-0 behind **Sarah Racine's** lone goal. They tied Bard 1-1 the next day.

Sophomore goalie **Madison Dudziec** was named the Landmark's Defensive Athlete of the Week on 9/10 after allowing just one goal in 290 minutes as Drew went 2-0-1 that week.

4 Lawson continues to lead the Landmark in goals and points. Not far behind is Racine from Drew, with 7 goals on the season and 15 points. Racine is tied for second in the conference in goals and tied for third in points. Racine's three game-winning goals rank tied for second in the league. She had back-to-back GWG on 9/5 at Manhattanville (W, 1-0) and 9/8 against Coast Guard (W, 1-0).

E-town currently sits in a tie for third in the conference standing at 1-1. Drew is currently on the outside looking in at the early playoff picture at 0-1-1. The Blue Jays lost at Susquehanna and beat Juniata while Drew tied Goucher and lost to Catholic.

5 Elizabethtown travels to face Moravian on Wednesday, October 10, at 7 p.m.
