

## ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® TEAM SELECTED BY COSIDA

Tuesday, December 3, 2019, 12 noon ET

## DANNY RUPLE OF BALDWIN-WALLACE, SHANNON REAGAN OF MARYVILE (TENN.) LEAD ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® DIVISION III MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SOCCER TEAMS

**AUSTIN, Texas –** Seniors **Danny Ruple** of Baldwin-Wallace and **Shannon Reagan** from Maryville (Tenn.) headline the 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-America® men's and women's soccer teams selected by the College Sports Information Directors Association (CoSIDA) and announced Tuesday.

The Division III Academic All-America® program is financially supported by the NCAA Division III national governance structure to assist CoSIDA with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2019-20 Division III Academic All-America® teams.

Ruple, a Berea, Ohio native and a forward, is the first B-W student-athlete in history to be named as a three-time first team Academic All-America®. He has a 3.92 GPA as an accounting/finance major and served as the Yellow Jackets team captain in both 2018 and 2019.

On-the-field, he is a four-time All-OAC honoree and was selected as the league's Forward of the Year in both 2017 and 2019. He had 17 goals and seven assists for 41 points this season on his way to being named first team All-OAC for the third straight year and All-OAC for the fourth time in his career.

Reagan, a 3.95 student as a biology major and a Tullahoma, Tennessee native, had 21 goals and 11 assists for 53 points this fall for the Scots. Maryville, the USA South Conference champion, finished the season with a 15-5 overall record after falling to Washington University in St. Louis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Reagan is the 2019 USA South Conference Player of the Year and a three-time All-USA South Conference honoree as well as a two-time All-South Region selection.

In addition to Ruple, the men have an additional seven repeat selections to the CoSIDA Academic All-America® team: Josh Koleske (St. Norbert); Jackson White (Macalester); John Fucick (Clarkson); DR Metart (Stevenson); Ian Adams (Calvin); Logan Bylsma (Hope) and Ben Potter (Middlebury) make up this group with all but Potter selected to the first team this fall. Adams was a first team honoree last year with Koleske, White, Furcick, Medtart, and Bylsma grabbing second team accolades. Potter moves up one spot this to second team after earning a third team nod in 2018.

The women have 10 repeat selections with three: **Emily Berzolla** (MIT); **Julia Panko** (Stevens Institute of Technology and **Carson Pokorny** (Christopher Newport) selected for a third straight year.

Pokorny leads this trio by being named to the first team for the third straight year. Berzolla was a third teamer in 2018 after joining Pokorny on the first team in 2017. Panko was a second team selection in both 2017 and 2018.

Devin Haupt (Piedmont); Faith Holloway (Chapman); Brooke Firestone (Messiah); Caroline Fleming (Adrian); Sarah Kogelmann (Connecticut College); Katy Mockett (Washington University in St. Louis) and Ashley St. Aubin (Augsburg) round out the women's repeat honorees. Haupt and St. Aubin were second team selections in 2018 and Holloway, Firestone, Fleming, Kogelmann, and Mockett picked to the third team.

Twenty-five of the 66 student-athletes on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® men's and women's soccer teams boast 4.0 GPAs with 14 of those 25 coming on the women's side. The first teams for both the men and women both boast 3.97 team GPAs with the full women's team at 3.96 and the men's at 3.93.
